***Replace Disposables**: When possible, replace disposable products with ones that can be reused at least twice. ***Simplify**: Simplify your life as much as possible. Keep mostly belongings that can be used /enjoyed on a regular basis. Making this effort to reduce what you own creates an attitude for less waste in the future. ***Areas to Simplify**: Purchase used whenever possible - Local Newspaper listings, Garage/yard sales. Local used furniture consignment stores. Local material exchange stores i.e. Habitat RESTORE outlets. <u>Ebay.com</u>, <u>Freecycle.com</u>(Free!) <u>Craigslist.com</u>, Amazon.com-search for specific refurbished product.

* **Borrow / share with friends/neighbors**: If only needed temporarily, ask if friend / neighbor could loan it. (Offer to loan something the other party may need in future.) Share things like books magazines, movies games, newspapers etc.

- * Create & use: Notepads from one side used paper. Read books, magazines from local library or online.
- * Reuse: Envelopes, gift paper, front of gift cards (as postcards).
- * Leave messages: For family on reusable message board.

Eastside Farmer's Market – by Sarah Reid


Try something FRESH & FUN!
