Detroit — The hashtags associated with the names of Ahmad Arbury, Breonna Taylor and now George Floyd have unfortunately all become too synonymous for every wrong reason you could possible fathom.

Those names, along with many others represent the many lives of African-American men and women who were all taken away from us by the heinous acts of white men who either wore badges representing law enforcement agencies or regular citizens who felt it was their prerogative to take matters in their own hands.

The entire world has witnessed the horrific video from Monday, May 25th as Mr. Floyd, who was handcuffed and pinned to the pavement by the knee of an officer pleaded for his life as he couldn't breathe.

Can I Live?... No More Hashtags for my fallen Brothers and Sisters

The pleas of "Please, please, please, I can't breathe," have left me with overwhelming emotions of anger, pain, and rage. The last few days I have asked myself over and over, "how can these acts continue to happen to us?

It is said that history has a way of repeating itself, sadly, it's true. It wasn't all that long ago that the very same statement "I Can't Breathe" was expressed by another black man as he pleaded for his life while in the hands of a white police officer.

On July 17, 2014, in Staten Island, New York, the words "I Can't Breathe" were echoed by 43-year-old Eric Garner who had an arm wrapped around his neck by former NYPD officer Daniel Pantaleo as he brought Garner to the ground. Pantaleo, along with several other officers pressed their weight onto Garner as his chest was compressed against the pavement resulting in Eric Garner suffering a fatal asthma attack.

The techniques used by the officers who killed both George Floyd and Eric Garner are banned methods within their respective departments.

Systemic Racism and police brutality against African Americans is something that has affected our community for generations. More times than not when we have expressed our displeasure against these injustices and the lack of fair opportunities, we're either ignored or receive pushback that we are over-exaggerating.

The tragic murder of George Floyd on May 25th validates everything we have ever expressed. It's painful that it took such a vile act for white America to realize what we been trying to get so many to understand forever.

To my white counterparts, I hope you realize that now, more than any other time in this country's history, you have a real responsibility to uphold. If you accept this challenge, you will be a part of the solution that will help heal the plague of the injustices and racism towards black and brown people in America.

If you are fully committed to this cause, hopefully George Floyd will be the last black man to ever have his name attached to the ill-fated hashtag of fallen African American men and women.
