## What Do You Want in Mack Avenue Streetscape?

Detroit — The Eastside Community Network (ECN) and the project team have been working with staff from the City of Detroit, the Grosse Pointes, and community organizations to develop preliminary design concepts for the Mack Avenue Streetscape Project. The first phase of the project kicked off in June 2022 to understand the walking, driving, and infrastructure conditions along Mack Avenue. Since December 2022, the project team has been facilitating community engagement to hear thoughts and ideas from residents, business owners, and local leaders about the future of the corridor. Numerous groups have been represented in community meetings thus far, including:

- Existing backlog of requests from prior years

## New DON Deputy Manager Starts With a Full Plate

Last month we introduced Caprice Johnson, District 4 Manager in the Department of Neighborhoods. This month it's Eboni Deberry's turn to take the spotlight. Eboni has only been Deputy Manager for District 4 since December, but she has hit the ground running. She takes a hands-on approach to her primary mission - helping to eliminate blight in our district. Not content to wait for complaints to come in, two or three days a week Eboni drives through neighborhoods in District 4, looking for pockets of blight and neglect so that she can report them to the appropriate city departments.

"I want to bridge the gap between neighborhoods," she says. Some are areas that have strong community organizations and involved residents, while others need lots of attention.

Eboni knows the neighborhoods of District 4 well, having grown up here. She attended Dominican High School and Grosse Pointe South before going to Grambling State University in Louisiana. She later earned a Master's Degree in Business Management from Walsh College.

Of course this is a job that requires an ability to work with all kinds of people, and Eboni's work history demonstrates she has plenty of "people skills." She spent almost a decade as a community liaison and new-hires trainer for the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services before moving to the Horatio Williams Youth Foundation to serve as its Community Director. In that position Eboni was responsible for running summer camps, tutoring programs, special events, and projects for seniors. She says one of the highlights during her tenure there was organizing the memorial service for Aretha Franklin at Chene Park in 2018.

Eboni says the best part of her new job is "being the point of contact for residents"...."I have a heart for people," she says. Her biggest challenge? "Not being able to personally take care of a problem myself...If somebody calls about their trash not being picked up, I can't go pick it up myself"...."I'm looking forward to Motor City Makeover when I can get my hands dirty," she says with a laugh.

When she's not fighting blight, Eboni enjoys spending time with her husband and two sons, 11 and 1. She also likes to travel. "My dream vacation is going to Santorini Island in Greece." In the meantime she's happy to chill out and bask in the Florida sun from time to time.

"Faith plays a major role in my life," Eboni adds. She is a member of Second Ebeneezer Church, where she sings on their praise team.

Several key themes were heard from the community through the engagement phase so far:

- Desire for a consistent look and feel on both sides of the street
- Address the infrastructure needs first lighting, sidewalks, crosswalks, overgrown areas, etc.
- Improve safety along the corridor in two ways:
- Traffic and mobility safety conditions
- Business and property safety
- Desire for Mack to feel like a main street rather than a commercial street
- Mack is a major vehicle connector and traffic needs to flow
- Strong desire for no bike lanes
- Desire for additional public art and beautification projects
- Low maintenance landscaping to reduce the amount of concrete, with special attention to not block views of businesses or their signage.



# Summer Jobs Program for Detroit Youth – Apply Now!

The ninth year of Grow Detroit's Young Talent (GDYT), the City of Detroit's summer work experience program for youth, has officially kicked off with a goal of providing over 8,000 summer employment opportunities for Detroit youth ages 14-24.

A total of 8,068 Detroit youth were employed through GDYT during 2022, the eighth straight year of exceeding the program's target of 8,000. To maintain social distancing protocols, GDYT made more than 5,500 of the 2022 summer opportunities virtual or hybrid, and the program will provide similar accommodations in 2023.

## How to get involved

Detroit youth interested in a summer job should visit GDYT.org to apply. The registration portal will be open until May 31. Organizations interested in becoming a sponsor or providing summer work experiences for Detroit youth may also register at the GDYT website.

## Pulling Back the Curtain on How Our City Operates

If knowledge is power, Detroiters are better equipped these days to exercise it, now that we have a number of local online publications dedicated to shedding light on the inner workings of city government and other influential political figures.

We've already introduced readers to some of these excellent news sources - Bridge Detroit, Bridge Michigan, Axios Detroit, and Model-D. Now we have a couple more filling an important niche for citizens who want to stay well informed.

Soapbox Detroit sends out an email each morning with notices of government committee and board meetings. It's geared toward those who want to get into the weeds of government operations or those who have an interest in a particular issue. Each meeting provides an opportunity for public comment. Soapbox Detroit also gives you easy access to important documents like the City Charter and city ordinances.

Detroit Documenters, a newsletter published by <u>Outlier Media</u>, takes a different approach to keeping citizens informed. They send trained volunteers to meetings to take notes, then Outlier Media reporters use those notes to write the kind of stories you often won't find in the mainstream media. 

- · Eligible for minor plumbing repairs for high water usage
