## To Mask or Not to Mask, That is the Question

Just when we thought it was okay to stash the N95 masks, we're being told we need to wear them outdoors now to protect ourselves from the effects of smoke from Canadian wildfires. We're all dealing with mask burnout after three years of Covid, so it's easy to ignore the most recent warnings and just go on about our business.

Unlike the masks we wore during the worst of the pandemic, which protected an entire community, now masking only affects the people wearing them, so it's important to consider individual health risk factors.

Sometimes the air quality affects only those who are older or have particular health problems, and sometimes the air is bad for everyone. This [article from NPR](#) spells out what you need to know to make an informed decision about masking during periods of high air pollution.

Although the risk from the current wildfires has waned, we know that heat and droughts caused by climate change are increasing the likelihood and severity of wildfires. There will be a next time, so be ready for it.

## Mixed-Use Development Breaks Ground on East Warren

It was a joyous occasion as I stood shoulder to shoulder with Eddy Carrington of Flux City Development, Mayor Duggan, funders, community leaders, and neighbors to celebrate the momentous groundbreaking ceremony of "The Ribbon." This remarkable event marked a significant milestone in developing a new mixed-use project in East English Village!

This dynamic development will provide 18 affordable housing units on E. Warren Ave, answering the pressing need for affordable housing options within our beloved community. We have not seen this kind of development in decades; and never has a project like this been led by a local Black developer. Detroiters do development differently, as evidenced by the deep affordability in a market of rising rental rates and property values.

I have lived two blocks from this location for 18 years, and I can remember so many years when this was a blighted corridor, and we were doing everything we could to salvage properties.

We probably thought it was all for naught, but we're here today. We all came together collectively and intentionally to ensure we revitalize our neighborhood commercial corridors. I can't wait for the completion of the project, and I look forward to Gajiza Dumplings opening and providing a much-needed sit-down restaurant in the community.

## Neighborhood Bike Ride to Balduck Park, Saturday, July 22

Join us for a neighborhood bike ride Saturday, July 22, from 10am - noon. Our destination is a true eastside gem, [Balduck Park](#).

Home to one of the most beloved sledding hills in Detroit, Balduck Park is one of thirteen Regional Parks in the City of Detroit park system. Located at 18151 East Warren in District 4, the 56-acre site is divided by Chandler Park Drive into a more active South end and a natural North end. The South end features a playground, baseball fields, basketball courts, soccer fields, walking path, and the sledding hill. The North end also has a playground, picnic shelter, dog park, and trails through the natural forest.

## Secret Garden Gallery Isn't a Secret Now

A lot has happened in Denise Moore's professional life since we first featured her passion project, ZAB Cultural Collective, in the December 2019 issue of The Morningsider. After a months-long shutdown due to the pandemic, she's thriving again and expanding her efforts to "build community through art, culture, and co-working."

Denise's latest project is The Secret Garden Gallery, an outdoor art market and garden she's created next to her contemporary art gallery and co-working space for artists on E. Warren. Every Saturday this summer from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m., you can browse or buy the work of local artists and enjoy the growing collection of murals, most painted by Denise herself, and other permanent outdoor art. You can transform yourself into a butterfly between the wings painted on one wall, or buy a cool drink and rest on a couch made of grass.

You'll also find plants, flowers, and vegetables for sale. "I consider flowers to be art," says Denise. "There's art created by humans, and art you find in nature. They're both important." She's creating a free seed and plant library – similar to the free libraries of used books you see in the neighborhood.

If you're lucky, you may even find a small treasure hidden somewhere in The Secret Garden Gallery. "We hide pieces of art in the garden," she says, "and if you find it, you keep it. Last week no one found the little painted flower pots we'd hidden."

As long as you're at The Secret Garden, check out the gallery and studio next door, which has paintings, pottery, and jewelry for sale, created by some of the fourteen artists who rent working space at ZAB Collective. There's also a space in the back which can be used for events related to the arts, community, or education.

Denise will also be happy to tell you all about the "niche artist communities" that she wants to bring to ZAB Collective, especially the "tiny art movement." Fascinating examples of tiny art are ACEO's - Art Cards Editions and Originals- which are paintings or drawings on cards the size of standard baseball cards. And like baseball cards, ACEOs are bought and sold or traded. Each card is unique and original and may sell for as little as 50 cents or as much as \$60-70.

*Mack Avenue Streetscape Plan*

**Streetscape Design Concepts**

The following streetscape design options build on preferences of the community for a safe, comfortable, and active Mack Avenue. These options are intended to show possible changes to the street and will be further refined based on your input.

Mack Avenue has been divided into the following three segments based on the amount of available roadway space:  
**Segment 1 - Conner to Balfour**    **Segment 2 - Balfour to Cadieux**    **Segment 3 - Cadieux to Moross**

**Segment 1 - Option A**

Adds curb bump outs and striped parking lanes

**Segment 1 - Option B**

Adds curb bump outs, landscaped median, and parking lanes.

**Segment 1 - Option C**

3 driving lanes with a raised mobility lane and curb bump outs.

**Segment 2 - Option A**

Adds curb bump outs and striped parking lanes.

**Segment 2 - Option B**

3 driving lanes with parking on both sides and landscaped crossing islands.

**Segment 2 - Option C**

3 driving lanes with parking on one side, a raised mobility lane, and crossing islands.

**Segment 3 - Option A**

Adds curb bump outs and striped parking lanes

**Segment 3 - Option B**

Adds curb bump outs, striped parking lanes, midblock crossings and widened sidewalks.

### DIY Air Cleaner to Reduce Wildfire Smoke Indoors

#### Materials




**20" X 20" air filter**  
Suggested rating: MERV 13

**20" X 20" box fan**  
Only use certified fans with UL or ETL marking (2012 model or newer)




**Clamps**

or



**Duct Tape**

or



**Bungee Cords**

#### Assembly

1. Attach the air filter to the back of the box fan using either clamps, duct tape or bungee cords.
2. Check the filter for the direction of the air flow (marked on the side of the filter).
3. Replace filters when dirty.
