• PROPERTY TAX FORECLOSURE:

- Wayne County Treasurer comes after people for unpaid taxes
- If you owe taxes for 2020 or before, your house will get foreclosed if not paid by March 31.
- Flyers are being passed out in the neighborhood to give information on how to save your home
- o Concentrating on homeowners to take action by end of month
- 14,000 homes citywide are in danger. The goal is to have 0 people lose their homes

• LEAD PAINT IN HOMES :

- You can get testing done in your home
- o Flyers are on the table regarding lead
- o Ford Resource Engagement Center Sat. event

• TIM KILLEEN – WAYNE COUNTY COMMISSIONER:

- County has a 1.7 Billion budget
- Property taxes collapsed in 2008 and the county lives off these taxes
- The county is behind because of lack of funds
- o Consent agreement was set and employee wages and medical took a hit
- Junk bond status has been helpful
- The completion of the jail is still happening scheduled to open in August
- 4,000 paid positions but 1,000 are vacant so it's hard to get services
- Have had 7 CFO's in 8 years and 4 Budget Directors in 5 years, 3 Directors of IT in 4 years
- 14 Prosecutors left to go to Macomb County
- Juvenile hearings have been held up because of court dates
- New bookkeeping system is on the way will be a 5 year 30 million dollar project
- Health and Human Services will hold a hearing about hazardous waste facilities
- Citizens Guide to Michigan Government gives valuable info

• <u>DEPARTMENT OF NEIGHBORHOODS – EBONI, DEPUTY DISTRICT MANAGER:</u>

- District meetings are the last Tuesday of every month
- Newsletter goes out every 3rd Thursday
- Trash and bulk contact with any problems
- Blight drive is a focus right now riding around looking for blight, vacant homes, cars, trash, etc.
- o Improve Detroit is the app to use and sends alerts to all the departments
- o Squatters is a 911 call
- Motorcity Makeover May 13th, Supplies can be picked up on May 10, flower pickup is May 12th
- Block clubs focusing on beautification

- Jobs are available for youth 14-24 years of age
- Adult scholarship is open and people can get paid to learn and read, and will get placed in a job

- o The City will pick up tree limbs that are trimmed and left if it's a City tree

• LANDBANK INFO:

- Wants to sell 42 houses to one developer which needs City Council approval
- 26 are landbank occupied properties
- There are some people living in them because they never moved out, or have moved in and taken it over
- o 11 of the 26 are in MorningSide
- Ron Nottingham is one of the people in a landbank house told his story
- o Bedford Development, Marvis Burns wants to buy the 42 houses
- Says he has brought houses up to code in the past
- His first priority when buying an occupied home is to bring it up to code
- Wants to give back grew up on the east side
- He tries to keep tenants in the property
- He works with the State to transition the homeless back into housing
- Renovated numerous houses and can handle this purchase of 42 houses
- Not here to displace people but to make the neighborhood better
- o Concentrating on MorningSide because of his love for the neighborhood.
- Usually buys the vacant lot that is next to any of the houses his company buys
- Will address all issues that neighbors have.
- o Eric invited the Landbank to the meeting but they declined because of time
- The City is starting to enforce that all rental properties be registered

• AGAPE LOVE CHILD CARE CENTER - SHERI WILLIAMS

- Home childcare facility with a partnership with Headstart
- Located on Three Mile
- Will have services for the community

• Have free childcare for low income ages 0-5
